Before commencing with Kulunga, Dr Scrine was employed as a Senior Research and Policy Officer in the Department of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Services and subsequently the Office of Indigenous Policy Coordination (OIPC).

In her role, Dr Scrine was involved in the development of strategic policy, programmes and regional planning and was the principal researcher and author of the ATSIC Western Desert Regional Council's Strategic Plan – A New Way of Doing Business.

Dr Scrine is currently a Senior Research Officer in the Kulunga Research Network where she is a member of a number of project teams involving research and evaluation with Aboriginal communities in Western Australia including the WA Aboriginal Child Health Survey, the Rio Tinto Child Health Partnership, BHP Billiton Health Partnership.

Dr Scrine is undertaking a review of the Stronger Families initiative which is being implemented in selected Aboriginal community sites the Kimberley, Northern Territory and Queensland.

Dr Scrine is well placed to be involved on this project. She has completed a Review of the new brokerage health service for the Wheatbelt Health Service. This project involved a literature review; program mapping; extensive stakeholder consultation and engagement including focus groups, one-to-one in-depth interviews, an email survey; the collation and analysis of findings, and preparation of a draft and final report.
