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Mr McAullay is currently working as a Senior Research Officer with the Kulunga Research Network and is enrolled as a PhD candidate with the Australian Primary Health Care Research Institute at the Australian National University.

He is one of ten senior Aboriginal researchers undertaking PhD or post-Doctoral study under the NHMRC Indigenous Capacity Building Grant, a prestigious opportunity designed to increase the research capacity of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

He has been involved in the National Health and Medical Research Council as a member of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Research Working Committee, member and chair of the Indigenous Health Research Panel and member of the Values and Ethics implementation committee.

Mr McAullay is also a member of the Steering Committee of the Western Australian Aboriginal Child Health Survey. Other Kulunga research projects with which Mr McAullay plays a key role include the Wheatbelt Health Service Review, the International Comparative Study of Indigenous Health.

Mr McAullay was previously employed as a Senior Policy Manager at the Health Department of Western Australia.

Daniel's involvement with the Institute began in 1999 when he was founding Manager of the Kulunga Research Network.
